It was a connoisseurial delight for my wife, Connie, and I to visit the Honey Creek Inn (formerly Joyce's, as well as other names) in Cannonsburg Township, a mere 20 miles northeast of Grand Rapids, adjacent to Townsend County Park on Five Mile Road and Honey Creek Road.

The decor is new oak booths, tables and bar. Each night Bill and Mike, the chefs, plan a special feature and Karlene makes something outstanding for dessert. They even let you take out if you promise not to litter!!!

But the main reason to go to the Honey Creek Inn is for their extraordinary collection of beers, bottled and draft. For example, on draft are (1) Bell's Beer, (2) Molson Golden, (3) Foster's, (4) Harp's, (5) Fuller's, and (6) Double Diamond. Furthermore, the best from the bottle includes Chimay White and La Grande Reserve from Belgium. You can also expect to find the usual fine brews like John Courage, Liberty, Guinness, and Grolsh.

We would like to encourage everyone to prepare an article of interest for publishing in the next edition of The Rubber Chicken.

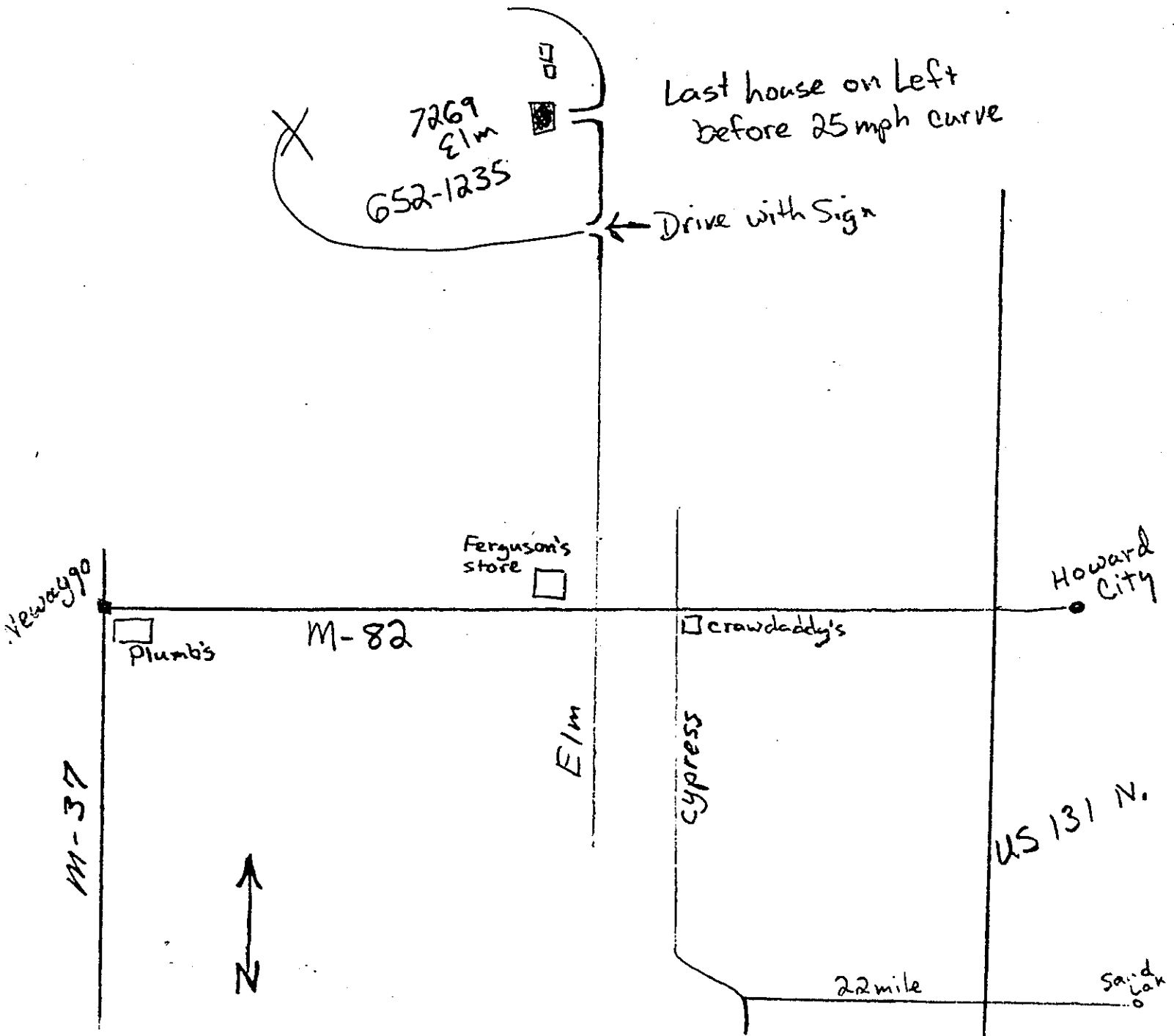
